#### Winter Watershed Wellness

Frigid temperatures mean that wintry weather is here! Just because it's cold, however, doesn't mean we can forget our waterways. Snow, sleet, and freezing rain will eventually melt, increasing water flow into our waterways. Practice smart winter preparedness to prevent pollution!

## Save your Salt!

Why do we care about being salt smart? It only takes one teaspoon of winter salt to permanently pollute 5 gallons of water! Winter salt that runs off of our sidewalks, driveways, and roads enters the environment causing:

- Elevated sodium levels in our drinking water and increased treatment costs.
- Harm to fish, plants, and other wildlife
- Corrosion of vehicles, roads, bridges, and parking lots that leads to costly maintenance and repairs over time.

## Scoop the Slush!

How can we take action to reduce salt impacts? When it snows, take the following steps to ensure that you are staying safe, but taking smart salt actions:

- Clear snow by shoveling early and often.
- Make sure to clear snow and apply salt only where needed.
- If the sun comes out and you can wait, let the sun do some of the work before you apply salt.
- After the storm, sweep up the extra salt and use it again the next time winter weather hits.

# **Partner Highlights:**

Here are some additional offerings from our #cleanwaterpartners for those who want to continue their conservation efforts.

#### **Conservation Assistance Programs**

The Conservation Assistance Programs (CAP) are urban cost-share programs that provide financial and technical assistance to property owners who would like to manage stormwater on their property using environmentally-friendly practices. These practices can be installed to address problems like erosion, poor drainage, or poor vegetation. Restrictions Apply.

#### Flood Mitigation Assistance Program

Funded by Fairfax County and administered by the Northern Virginia Soil and Water Conservation District, the Flood Mitigation Assistance Program (FMAP) offers applicants 50% reimbursement—up to a maximum of \$5,000—for the costs of projects that protect their properties from flood damage. Projects on FMAP's <u>Approved List of Practices</u>, or those approved on a case-by-case basis by the Northern Virginia Soil & Water Conservation District, are eligible for reimbursement.

#### Stormwater Infrastructure Grant

Stafford County Officially awarded four separate HOAs grant funding for the first two rounds of our Neighborhood Stormwater Infrastructure Grant program. Restrictions apply.

Stafford County invites their residents to fill out Stream Cleanup Area Interest Form for residents to identify good areas for trash pickups.
